- Master Gardener Jennifer Rozeski
  - Volunteer with UW gardening program
  - Educate public and pollinator issues
    - Bees
    - 400 500 species of bees
    - Very few bumble and honey bees
    - Leafcutter bees make holes in Rose bushes
    - Most bees are solitary bees
      - o Come out once a year
      - 4-6 week lifespan
      - Females gather nectar
      - Lay egg on cell build of various materials
      - Not likely to sting vs. social bees defending hive
    - Bees are very important and peaceful

- Transit oriented development study
- Downtown streetcar will open in November
- Mayor committed to expanded lines into adjacent neighborhoods
- Transit oriented development study to get input before anything begins
- Final public meeting Aug. 14 tentatively
- Development near stops, not displacing established neighborhood aspects
- Looking to create critical mass with people to use streetcar and establishments to generate traffic coming to areas.
- Zoning changes, potentially to increase density
- King drive rebuild potential during streetcar build out
  - Bike lanes
  - Increased sidewalk space
- Walkable neighborhood is a priority
  - Traffic slowing
  - Daily shopping, restaurants
- Prevent displacement of existing neighborhoods
  - Mixed income residential
  - Development in transit and corresponding development in housing
- Many of the development plans can be implemented with or without the streetcar
